# A Message from Pr. Carl

PR. CARL WILFRID

When I retired from full time ministry in 2014, gifted with good health, good energy, and 45 years of experience, I prayed that I could still be useful to our ELCA and Sierra Pacific Synod. That prayer was answered in ways that I expected (many, but not too many, Sundays of preaching and presiding at various area congregations, including our own), and in some unexpected ways (helping to mentor a young Reno pastor, serving at St. John's in Sacramento as part-time interim senior pastor while their senior pastor was on a 3 month sabbatical). But these 7 weeks here at Faith, Chico, helping Pr. Ben accomplish his sabbatical, have been the tasty whipped cream and cherry on top of my retirement sundae!

When I learned in Faith Talks that Pr. Ben's application for sabbatical funding had not been approved, but that the council and congregation were working diligently to make that sabbatical happen anyway, I sent an email to Ben, saying, "My 1993 sabbatical was a most valuable time for me and for the congregation. If there is anything I can do to help make yours happen, let me know."I was thinking maybe a funeral for some old timer whose family remembered me, something like that. I heard from Ben a few weeks later. He said, "Carl, I'm going to swing for the fences: the Council and I would like you to back to Chico come and serve congregation part time from July 1 to August 18." I am honored to have been invited, and delighted that, despite some trepidations about my age (80) and mental acuity (the elevator doesn't always reach the top floor these days), I was able to do the job fairly well.



When I left this congregation in 2000 after 20 years as pastor, I thought I would miss individual people, our friendships. I discovered, however, that what I missed most was being the body of Christ with you! These 7 weeks have been for Dianne and me fun reconnecting time with many old friends, but it has been especially good to again "be church" with you, to see and experience how well you care for each other and for the hungry, homeless and vulnerable ones in the larger community.

While we are looking forward to returning to our home and friends in Reno, to our familiar drug stores we visit frequently, and doctors and hairdresser and physical therapist and more, this time has also been a kind of sabbatical for Dianne and me, a time away from our usual routine in which we have lived in new ways and learned new things. But wherever we are, at Don and Carolyn's house in Chico, at a shed in a church member's back yard in Sacramento, or at our own home in Reno, Dianne proves herself to be a genius at "making a place a home," and a treasured companion on all my "adventures in usefulness." I applaud and thank her!

Faith Lutheran Church in Chico is always in my heart and prayers. I wish you, Pr. Ben and the congregation, a rich time of post-sabbatical reconnecting and ministry partnership.

### Dir. Youth & Children Job Desc.

The Faith Lutheran Church Council recently approved the following job description for the new position of Director of Children and Youth Ministry. The council is work our HR Committee put description! If you have any Council member.

#### **Purpose**

To focus on ministry with children and youth and develop spiritual and faith resources for them and their families within the ELCA tradition. To recruit, equip, and nurture volunteers to serve with confidence and to build a sustainable system for ministry.

#### **Essential Responsibilities**

- Participate in the life of Faith Lutheran Church and the larger church as able.
- Serve as a leader for faith formation ministries for children and youth.
- Participate in staff meetings and coordination of ministries with other staff persons.
- Articulate to the congregation the purpose and goals for children and youth ministry.
- Build and maintain collaborative relationships with children, youth, parents/guardians.
- Work in cooperation with other staff members and leadership of the congregation.
- Build and maintain a network of professional relationships and pursue continuing education in children and youth ministry.
- Coordinate and integrate children and youth ministries with congregational ministries.
- Communicate events and opportunities within and outside of the congregation for children and youth.
- Recruit and supervise volunteers for the children and youth ministry.
- Provide an ongoing training program for volunteers.
- Provide resources specific to volunteers.
- Develop and work with a volunteer team to cultivate sustainable structures for ongoing ministry.

- Develop a faith formation plan for children and youth.
- Maintain a weekly time to rest from the responsibilities of the job.
- Set aside regular times to reflect on the ministry and set long-term priorities.
- Meets with their Council Representative regularly.
- Other duties/responsibilities as assigned.

#### **Essential Duties (Children):**

- Work with a Children's Ministry Team and meet monthly or as needed with the Team to plan and execute the children's ministry.
- Review and help select curricula for Christian education opportunities for children including Vacation Bible School, Children and Worship, and Sunday School programs for preschool children and elementary-age children.
- Provide opportunities for children to gain appreciation for worship and service.

#### **Essential Duties (Youth):**

- Work with a Youth Ministry Team and meet monthly or as needed with the team to plan and execute youth ministry.
- Review and help the Youth Team select curricula for Sunday school classes.
- Work with the Pastor on the Confirmation program.

#### Required Knowledge and Skills

- Enjoy working with children and youth.
- Demonstrate excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Possess a gift for listening, understanding, and offering wise counsel.
- Be self-directed and have strong organizational skills.
- Have leadership skills required to equip volunteers for ministry.
- Be able to create and develop a long-range vision for children's and youth ministry.
- Work collegially and in close consultation with the pastor, staff, leaders, and volunteers of the church.
- Demonstrate understanding and effective use of Microsoft or Google suites and social media platforms.
- Be comfortable with learning new software as needed.

#### **Qualifications and Education**

- Preferred 2 years of experience with children's and/or youth ministry.
- A bachelor's degree preferred.
- An understanding of developmental stages for children and or youth.
- Passage of a background check required upon accepting a conditional offer of employment.



### BATHROOM PROJECT

Since our education building was built, we've had one small, toddler's toilet in the Sunday School room. Teachers and older children have had to go to the Fellowship Hall to use the toilet which as you can imagine has been problematic! But as a part of our Capital Campaign, our parishioners financially supported the installation of a fully functional, ADA-compliant bathroom with 2 toilets: one exclusive to Sunday School (which can accommodate adults as well now) and one available to anybody renting the education wing. No more migrating to the Fellowship Hall! The project is ahead of schedule, and we wanted to show you these pictures taken on August 28th so that in next month's edition you can compare the two. 
