Exciting Changes for January!

We're making some fun updates to Sunday School to make it even better:

Extended Sunday School Time

Sunday School will now run through the entire worship service, with an extra 15-20 minutes of supervised care afterward. This will:

- Give kids more time to dig into their lessons, do crafts, play games, and sing songs.
- · Let kids hang out with their friends and have some fun!
- Allow parents to enjoy coffee hours without rushing to pick up their kids.
- Parents can choose to have their kids stay in Sunday School during Communion if they prefer.



Welcome Table

We're setting up a new Welcome Table, staffed by volunteers and older kids. This will:

- Help new families sign up for Sunday School.
- Provide family-specific resources and info.
- Be a friendly first point of contact for new families joining us at Faith Lutheran.

"Procare" App Check-In

We're using a new app called Procare for a smooth, secure check-in process:

- Track attendance each week.
- Make pick-up safe by requiring ID from guardians.
- Collect important info like allergies or special needs.
- Enable quick communication with you in case of emergencies.

Setting Up a Youth Group!

In mid-January, I'll be meeting with Jr High and High School students to set up a youth group for their age group, along with planning some fun activities and scheduling a regular meeting day. I can't wait to get this started and create opportunities for our older kids to connect and grow together!

Pastor's Article

In these cold and wet winter months, John the Baptist's instructions in Luke 3:11 become particularly poignant: "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none, and whoever has food must do likewise." People of Faith, I am continually amazed by your generosity and service to those most in need, both in our community and around the world. Just in December, I counted ten ministries that you carried out to address the needs of the most vulnerable.

#1) In direct response to John the Baptist's call to share extra coats, you collectively donated over one hundred coats to the 6th Street Center for Youth, which provides a safe place where youth experiencing homelessness can acquire the skills, resources and opportunity they need to transition into healthy independent living and adulthood. But you wanted to do even more for 6th Street.



- #2) Through a silent auction, you raised over \$400 dollars to support 6th Street's services.
- #3) Through our Giving Tree, you provided 40 beautifully wrapped gifts for 20 children in need at Citrus and Rosedale Elementary, plus gift cards for 6 families. You also provided gift cards for the women of the Mercy House, a partnership between Faith Lutheran and Chico Housing Action Team, that has transformed my mother's house into a home for four women with long-term medical needs who have no other place to live.
- #4) Every week, two of you meet with the women of the Mercy House to give them support and encouragement. (See Roses, pg. 11 to read thank-yous from the residents.)
- #5) On the 1st Tuesday of the month, just like every month, you made dinner for over 120 people at the Torres Shelter. And you invited the congregation to learn how to do it with you. If you'd like to learn how to cook meals for the Torres Shelter, Elise Gladu has invited you to join her on January 7th as she does it. Please reach out either to her directly, or to the office for more information.
- #6) On the 1st and 3rd Friday of the month, like every month, you handed out over 300 free boxes of groceries in our parking lot food bank. You did this in partnership with the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano Counties. Some of you handed out those boxes directly, but all of you supported this ministry by your generous giving to Faith. Your financial support allows us to maintain the parking lot to handle both the fully loaded semi-truck that delivers the groceries, and hundreds of cars that come through to pick them up.

#7) This month you become the commissary kitchen for Church of the Homeless Jesus, a ministry that brings the Good News of Jesus to the homeless and hungry. COHJ serves hot breakfast along with a message of hope and salvation on Sunday mornings at the 20th street park where all the soccer fields are. They are serving 250 breakfast sandwiches to over 100 people on Sunday mornings, along with a full worship service that includes preaching and music. They were recently gifted a food truck which will help their food preparation. City code requires that all food trucks be affiliated with a licensed commercial kitchen, hence the ask to affiliate with our kitchen. What this means is every couple of weeks they need to fill their water tank with the water in our kitchen, and empty their water down our drain. It is a benefit to people working to help the lost dedicate their lives to Jesus, and a small cost to the church, but it is you who pays to maintain our commercial status and water bill. You make this partnership possible.

#8) In December, you agreed to host Safe Space Winter Shelter, a low-barrier shelter that allow families and their pets to sleep in our fellowship hall, Jan. 26-Feb. 8. Many of you have signed up to cook meals for these guests. All of you supported this ministry by your generous giving to Faith. The council calculated that it costs Faith about \$100/week in PG&E bills to host Safe Space. We gladly pay this cost to carry out the Biblical command to care for our neighbors. You make it possible.

#9) It is not only our neighbors here in Chico for whom you have cared, but those around the world. Through purchasing crafts made by Christians living around Bethlehem, you were able to send \$1,623 to families who had lost their livelihood due to the violence in Gaza.

#10) And finally, this December, you restarted our decades-long ministry to Rancho Santa Marta, a school and orphanage for special needs children in Baja, Mexico. You shared what a difference this ministry makes not only in the lives of its students, but also in the lives of those of us who go and do manual labor for the school. You invited us to consider joining the mission trip on June 7-15th.

If you would like more information about how to be involved with any of these ministries, let us know. We'll put you in touch with the right people. These are just the ministries this month that I know of. Thank you for taking seriously our calling as followers of Jesus to care for our neighbors in need. You are my continual inspiration for what it means to live out Christ's love. I am honored to serve as your pastor.


